500+ convene in Fox Cities for state DEI conference

The Fox Cities Chamber was proud to be a partner and sponsor of the **2023 Toward One (T1) Wisconsin Conference**. The two-day program brought more than 650 people together in April to connect and commit to taking individual and collective actions towards overcoming exclusionary practices and to help ensure our places of work, organizations, and communities are welcome to all. The event had a significant impact on our local economy, with hundreds patronizing our hotels, shops, and restaurants!



Childcare Alliance Learning + Action

The Greater Fox Valley Child Care Alliance came together a few years back to address growing concerns around how the accessibility, affordability, and quality of Early Care and Education (ECE) in the region was directly affecting families' stability and the region's economic recovery.

With support from the Basic Needs Giving Partnership, the Alliance developed a shared vision, explored the underlying systemic root causes contributing to current ECE challenges in the region, and prioritized a set of system change goals to inform action.

The Alliance has now launched the first of three strategy action teams to support advancement of goals. Eric Broten from the Chamber's Regional Partnership is participating on Action team #1: Advocate for sustainable funding mechanisms to support viable child care operations and workforce wages. Action teams for Strategy #2 and #3 will be launched by end of summer.
