# Chamber's STEAM program has a record 150 high school girls attend

As our year-long 150th anniversary celebration continues, we achieved our goal of hosting a record 150 girls from 18 different schools at Smart Girls Rock!, an event for middle and high school age girls interested in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) careers.

The goal of the event, held this year at **Miller Electric**, is to inspire more young women to engage in local STEAM programs. The day-long, interactive mentoring event includes a diverse lineup of participants with the hopes of fostering meaningful interactions and inspiring the next generation of female leaders to pursue careers in STEAM fields.

Interactive activities included welding, graphic design, "concrete" mixing, building planes out of recyclable materials, encapsulation, body composition testing, and so much more. The day also included lunch, door prizes, and presentations from sponsor companies.
